- 11 Private Universities (PU)

- 210.125 students
- 9.829 students in UCE

Special Features of UCE

V Signal system and gateway for

- Non-academic professions
- New demands and requirements

V Diversity in programs/formats

- Academic Expert (60 ECTS)
- MA-programs comparable to international MA-programs
- Courses and Certified programs
- Open lectures, workshops (widening participation)

V Diversity in Accreditation

- No obligatory external accreditation at the universities
- External accreditation for PUs and FHs

Main findings

V Diversified organization and structure

- Decentralized in departments/faculties
- Support through centers or staff units
- Outsourced as association or Ltd. (GmbH) executive education

V Diversified Systems of Quality Assurance

- Wide range of tools embedded in Quality Management Systems
- Accreditation procedures (PU, FH)

V Diversity in Access

- Open in "Universitätslehrgang" -"equivalent qualification"
- Academic orientation of UCE on MA level vs. professional qualification
